

HISTORIC ESCO PRICING DATA (Matter No. 14-02555):

INFORMATION TO BE FILED:

Separate average unit price for products with no energy-related value-added services for each of the **four categories** of customers listed below, and by geographic area (either the distribution utility service territory or, if different within the service territory, by ISO load zone). ESCOs shall also file the number of customers purchasing products in those categories. The averages should be weighted by the amount of commodity sold at each price within each category.

Commented [RT1]: At this time the Commission has stayed the requirement for reporting small non-residential customers. You are currently only required to report for residential customers.

WHEN TO FILE:

Data is to be filed quarterly, reflecting data over the previous period, within 30 days of the end of each calendar quarter.

1st Quarter: January 1st – March 31st (due no later than April 30th)

2nd Quarter: April 1st – June 30th (due no later than July 30th)

3rd Quarter: July 1st – September 30th (due no later than October 30th)

4th Quarter: October 1st – December 31st (due no later than January 30th)

HOW TO FILE FOR BOTH PUBLIC AND TRADE SECRET:

ESCOs are directed to e-file this information with the Secretary by the due date listed above in DMM **Matter Number: 14-02555**. Directions on how to file with the Secretary can be found on our website:

PRODUCT CATEGORIES:

1.) Residential price fixed for a minimum of 12 month period: A fixed price (a price established by a seller, by agreement of the customer, as the price to be charged) for electric and/or gas for a minimum of a 12 month period for an individual or occupant of a residential premise as defined in 16 NYCRR Part 11.2(a)(2).

2.) Residential variable price: A variable price (different rates to be charged to different customers for the same goods or services) for an individual or occupant of a residential premise as defined in 16 NYCRR Part 11.2(a)(2).

3.) Small non-residential price fixed for a minimum 12 month period: A fixed price (a price established by a seller, by agreement of the customer, as the price to be charged invariably) for electric and/or gas for a minimum of a 12 month period for a non-residential electricity customer in a utility service classification that does not have a demand rate element or a non-residential customer in a utility service classification that provides firm service.

4.) Small non-residential variable price: A variable price (different rates to be charged to different customers for the same goods or services) for electric and/or gas for a non-residential electricity customer in a utility service classification that does not have a demand rate element or a non-residential customer in a utility service classification that provides firm service.
