Objectives:

- To identify potential products and transactions that will occur between various players – the DSPP, Distributed Energy Resources (DER) providers, customers and third parties;
- To establish a possible framework for valuing products and services;
- To recommend potential market structure(s) that would facilitate transactions between parties, provide value to all players, and improve electric system efficiency while considering State public policy objectives;
- To identify barriers or potential regulatory reforms needed to facilitate the purchase or sale of existing or new products or services;
- To identify interactions that will occur between all players and NYISO wholesale markets and identify potential rule changes that might be necessary.

Topics to be Addressed:

Products/Services

- Products DSPP will buy from DER owners and customers
- Products to be bought by Customers, ESCOs and third parties
- Attributes and benefits/value of products
- Metrics for valuation of products

REV Market Structure

- Short-term/Stage 1 Market Structure
- Role of the DSPP in Increasing DER Penetration

Barriers/Regulatory Reforms

- Barriers that exist to the entry/sale of existing or new products
- Regulatory reforms needed to address issues related to specific products or market structure

Interaction with Wholesale Market

- Products DSPP will it buy from/sell to the NYISO and how will it differ from today
- DSPPs as the aggregator of aggregators
- Third party interactions with wholesale markets
- Need for potential modifications to NYISO market rules

Committee Structure

- The Committee consists of over 170 members
- Steering Committee
 - In order to create an effective “working group”, a Steering Committee of about 15 members, representing each of the sectors, was created.
 - The role of the Steering Committee is to represent other Committee members by gathering input from committee members on specified topics, discussing acquired information at in-person Steering Committee meetings, and using the information to collectively draft a document to be presented to the Commission.
