



## **National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation Proposed Rate Increase**

**Case 16-G-0257**

In April 2016, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation (NFG) requested that the New York State Public Service Commission approve a proposed increase in its gas delivery service rates. NFG serves approximately 527,000 customers in parts of ten counties in Western New York.

Upon receipt of the rate filing, Department of Public Service (DPS) Staff began an analysis of the Company's request to evaluate whether – or to what extent – a rate increase is justified. DPS represents the public interest in rate proceedings and evaluates such requests with the goal of ensuring safe and reliable service at just and reasonable rates.

Review of the NFG filing is also underway by other parties to the proceeding.

### **Public Statement Hearings**

The Commission is seeking comment on the proposed increase to gas service rates. An Administrative Law Judge will preside over the gathering of public comments and all evidence relating to the rate request. The comments made at the hearings will become part of the formal record in these proceedings and will be presented to the Commission for consideration. Under New York State Law, the Commission must consider a utility's proposal and may adopt or reject it in whole or in part, or modify it by adopting changes not proposed by the Company, but by participating parties, the general public or the Commission.

Interested members of the public are invited to attend the public statement hearings and provide comments regarding the proposal. The hearings will be preceded by an information session where an NFG representative will describe the Company's filing and DPS Staff will explain the rate case process and how individuals can participate. It is not necessary to make an appointment in advance or present written material in order to speak at the hearings.

## SUMMARY OF THE RATE CASE

On April 28, 2016, NFG filed for new gas rates to be effective beginning April 1, 2017. This is the first rate increase sought by NFG since 2007. According to the filing, the Company's proposal will enable the NFG to provide safe and reliable gas service through continued modernization of its pipeline infrastructure and customer information technology systems. NFG asserts that the rate request will also allow the Company to provide enhanced low income customer programs and continue economic area development and possible gas expansion initiatives.

### **Proposed Rates:**

A gas bill consists of two components: delivery and supply. The *delivery* component recovers the cost to transport the gas to customers throughout the utility's gas delivery system. The delivery component of the gas bill is regulated by the Commission. The *supply* component of the gas bill recovers the cost of the gas commodity itself. The cost of the gas commodity is determined by the competitive market place and is not set by the Commission or the utility.

Under NFG's proposal, gas delivery rates would be modified to increase the Company's annual gas delivery revenues by approximately \$41.7 million (a 15.27% delivery revenue increase). If the proposed rate request were to be approved, the Company estimates that the annualized monthly bill for gas service to a residential heating customer using 83 therms per month will increase by approximately \$5.75 (or 7.2% on the total bill). The projected residential heating customer's total bill impact is based on estimated supply costs.

### **Rate Case Components:**

- **System Modernizations:** Included in NFG's proposal is funding to modernize pipeline infrastructure, including implementing a cost recovery mechanism that will permit the Company to accelerate its replacement of aging pipes. The proposal calls for increasing the current target of 95 miles of main replaced annually to a target of 110 miles in 2018. The Company also plans to replace its aging customer information system with current technology to increase reliability and provide customers with the most up to date and accurate information.
- **Low Income Programs:** NFG proposes to enhance its low income programs, including expanding its HEAP Residential Assistance Service program and waiving initial reconnection fees for eligible customers.
- **Gas Expansion:** As part of the rate request, the Company will continue to seek opportunities to expand its service to new customers and new areas.

## PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

Some individuals or groups participate in rate cases by becoming a party in the case. Persons unable or unwilling to receive such electronic notification will receive hard copies of Commission-issued documents by regular mail.

- **Monitor the Case on the Commission Website:** Interested persons who choose not to sign up to receive e-mail notifications can view our website at their convenience to check on the status of a case. All documents filed by parties, correspondence, hearing transcripts, and Commission issued documents in a given case are posted on the website. All comments submitted by the public are posted under the 'public comments' tab for the case.
- **Provide Comments:** There are opportunities to attend public outreach events to learn about the proposals and provide comments. All comments can be submitted at the public statement hearings held on June 28 or 29, 2016 or through the methods below:
