Coeymans Solar Farm Public Statement Hearings Scheduled

40 MW Photovoltaic Solar Electric Generating Facility Proposed for Albany County

ALBANY — The New York State Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment (Siting Board) today announced it will hold two public statement hearings in the Town of Coeymans (Albany County) to receive comments on the Hecate Energy Albany 1 LLC and Hecate Energy Albany 2 LLC (Hecate Albany) proposal to build and operate a 40-megawatt photovoltaic solar electric generating facility in the Towns of Coeymans, Albany County. The project would consist of arrays of ground-mounted photovoltaic solar panels installed on a 436-acre site. Points of interconnection with the electric grid would be to existing National Grid 115 kilovolt transmission lines that cross the southern portion of the project site.

At the informational forum, the examiners will provide an overview of the Siting Board's certification process and the developer will present a brief summary of the proposed project. A map of the proposed project area will be available for viewing. Members of the public will then have an opportunity to pose questions about the process and the certificate application pending before the Siting Board.

At the public statement hearing, any person wishing to provide a public statement must complete a request card and the examiners will use the request cards to call each person who has requested to provide a statement on the record. Reasonable time limits may be set for each speaker as necessary to afford all attendees an opportunity to be heard. Lengthy comments may be submitted in writing and summarized for oral presentation. A transcript of the hearing will be made for inclusion in the record of this case.

Although comments will be accepted throughout the pendency of this proceeding, they are requested by no later than June 30, 2020.

Via the Internet or Mail: The public may enter comments directly into the case file from the Department of Public Service website, www.dps.ny.gov, by clicking on "Search" at the top of the page and then entering "17-F-0617" into the "Search by Case Number" field. In the open case, access the screen to enter comments by clicking on the "Post Comments" box at the top right of the page. Comments may also be submitted electronically to the Hon. Michelle L. Toll-Free Opinion Line: Individuals may choose to submit comments by calling the Department of Public Service's Opinion Line at 1-800-335-2120. This line is set up to receive in-state calls 24-hours a day. These calls are not transcribed but a summary is provided to the presiding Examiners, who will report to the Siting Board.
