3 CHAIRMAN RHODES: I call this session
4 of the Public Service Commission to order. Secretary
5 Phillips, our new secretary. Hi, Michelle. Are
6 there any changes to the final agenda?

7 SECRETARY PHILLIPS: No, there are no
8 changes to the final agenda.

9 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you very much.
10 So, we'll get right to it. The first and only item
11 for discussion is item 301 case 18-T-0207, as it
12 relates to the Moses Adirondack Transmission Project
13 presented by Administrative Law Judge James Costello.
14 Administrative Law Judge Gregg Sayre is available for
15 questions. Judge Costello, please begin.

16 A.L.J. COSTELLO: Good morning,
17 Chairman Rhodes and members of the commission. My
18 name is James Costello. I am one of the two
19 Administrative Law Judges who are assigned to this
20 case. Administrative Law Judge Gregg Sayre, seated
21 immediately to my left and to your -- would be to
22 your right also is assigned to this case. This item
23 is a proposed order of the commission granting
24 pursuant to Public Service Law Article 7, a
25 Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public

2 Need to the Power Authority of the State of New York,
3 doing business as the New York Power Authority, which
4 I will refer to from now on as NYPA.

5 The certificate would authorize NYPA
6 to rebuild and operate its existing 230 kilovolt
7 Moses Adirondack one and two transmission lines,
8 which I will refer to from now on as the MA One and
9 Two lines, and to construct certain upgrades to the
10 Moses Switchyard and the Adirondack -- Adirondack
11 Substation. The MA One and Two lines extend
12 approximately 86 miles from the St. Lawrence Power
13 Project's Robert Moses Power Dam Switchyard in the
14 Town of Massena, St. Lawrence County to the
15 Adirondack Substation in the Town of Croghan, Lewis
16 County.

17 NYPA would divide the project into two
18 phases.

19 Phase One would consist of replacing
20 78 miles of the two lines that are currently
21 configured as single circuits on separate, wooden H-
22 frame structures with two new single circuit lines on
23 steel monopoles. Although NYPA intends to design and
24 construct the transmission lines with the capacity to
25 operate at 345 kilovolts, it would operate the lines

2 at the current 230 kilovolt level until completion of
3 the second phase of the project.

4 Assuming a certificate is issued, NYPA
5 anticipates that the first phase of the project will
6 begin construction in January 2020 and be completed
7 in June 2023.

8 Phase Two of the project would involve
9 replacing the remaining lines of the transmission
10 lines with two single circuits on steel monopoles and
11 upgrading the Moses Switchyard and the Adirondack
12 Substation to operate at 345 kilovolts. Phase Two
13 would be coordinated with a similar upgrade of
14 National Grid's Adirondack to Porter 230 Kilovolt
15 line to operate at 345 kilovolts. Prior to operating
16 the project at 345 kilovolts, NYPA would request an
17 amendment of the certificate to allow it to operate
18 at that higher kilovolt level and would be required
19 to include an updated system impact study with its
20 request.

21 Except for an approximately one mile
22 re-route at the State University of New York at
23 Canton Campus, NYPA would construct the project
24 entirely within an existing right-of-way that it
25 maintains. SUNY Canton owns the land required for

2 the routing change and has agreed to provide NYPA
3 with a right-of-way across the state owned land in
4 exchange for NYPA's release of its existing right-of-
5 way through the center of the SUNY Canton campus.

6 The project would not change the
7 existing land use on the right-of-way and would
8 remove approximately half of the existing
9 transmission support structures currently in the
10 right-of-way. Approximately, one-point-eight miles
11 of the project is within the Adirondack Park and in
12 the park, the project would use the existing right-
13 of-way, increase the span length between structures
14 and thereby, decrease the number of structures within
15 the park. This project is needed to ensure reliable
16 service throughout New York State. The facilities
17 proposed to be rebuilt are more than 76 years old,
18 well past their design lives. Rebuilding the lines
19 would make them less susceptible to failure and would
20 reduce maintenance costs. The lines are needed to
21 transmit power generated by Hydro and other renewable
22 facilities and possible fuel facilities in Canada and
23 Upstate New York. Rebuilding the lines with an
24 increased capacity would provide for future expansion
25 to meet New York's clean energy goals, which will

2 require substantial investment in new renewable
3 generation and associated transmission capacity in
4 Northern New York.

5 In addition, the lines are and will
6 continue to be needed to re-energize the bulk
7 electric system as a component of the New York
8 Independent System Operators System Restoration Plan
9 in the event of a widespread power outage. The
10 proposed order is the result of a comprehensive
11 settlement memorialized in the terms and conditions
12 of a joint proposal or J.P., as I'll refer to it.
13 The J.P. in this case is supported by four parties
14 that have been active in this proceeding, NYPA,
15 Department of Public Service Staff, The Department of
16 Environmental Conservation and the Department of
17 Agriculture and Markets. Those are the signatory
18 parties to the J.P. No party opposes the J.P. and no
19 public comments opposing the J.P. have been docketed
20 in this case. The J.P. describes the project as
21 proposed by the signatory parties and includes
22 several appendices, which set forth recommended
23 commission findings, certificate conditions,
24 specifications for developing the environmental
25 management and construction plan and a proposed water

2 quality certification. The J.P. addresses the
3 statutory and regulatory issues pertaining to NYPA's
4 certificate request, adequately discusses all
5 probable environmental impacts and addresses the
6 steps needed to ensure that the project as proposed
7 represents the minimal adverse environmental impact
8 considering the state of available technology and the
9 nature and economics of various alternatives and
10 other pertinent considerations.

11 The process provided all interested
12 parties and the public a full opportunity to
13 participate and the parties adhere to our settlement
14 rules and guidelines. This proceeding included
15 numerous opportunities for public input. The terms,
16 the conditions of the J.P. will produce a reasonable
17 result that is in the public interest and consistent
18 with the applicable state and commission policies.
19 Accordingly, we recommend that the commission adopt
20 the proposed order certificate conditions, the joint
21 proposal and appendices to the joint proposal with
22 certain modifications. Thank you.

23 We are now available for any questions
24 that the commissioners may have.

25 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you, Judge

2 Costello. I see this as a smart, careful, timely
3 project as valuable for the statewide system needs
4 and for the statewide renewable energy needs. It's
5 well-designed. It has good minimization of impact
6 with the -- the very good use of existing right-of-
7 way, attention to land use, attention to habitats,
8 and on balance is, as a result on balance is very
9 much in the public interest. I also find this has
10 been a good process, open, transparent with good and
11 full public opportunity to comment. I am going to
12 support this -- this project. Commissioner Burman.

13 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: Thanks. I also
14 support this project and echo the words of the Chair
15 and agree with it. So, I'll be supportive. Thank
16 you.

17 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Commissioner Alesi.

18 COMMISSIONER ALESI: Thank you, Mr.
19 Chairman. I'll be supporting this. It looks to me
20 like all the bases have been covered. The four major
21 entities that are mentioned in the report have put
22 forth good reasons why this should be done and in a
23 cohesive way. Particularly important to me was the
24 attention given to the environment and some of the
25 threatened species and things of that nature, going

2 through the Adirondack Park, etcetera, etcetera. I'm
3 just surprised that given the current condition of
4 things that maybe this might have been done sooner
5 but, in any event, it's before us right now so, I'll
6 be happy to support it and I'm just curious if the
7 person to your left -- oh, welcome back.

8 A.L.J. SAYRE: Thank you.

9 COMMISSIONER ALESI: I'll be
10 supporting this.

11 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you very much.
12 Commissioner Edwards.

13 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Thank you. I
14 just have a couple of questions. It looks like, it
15 says that it's going through 12 towns.

16 A.L.J. COSTELLO: Correct.

17 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: But the public
18 sessions were not held in all of the towns, unless
19 I'm reading it incorrectly.

20 A.L.J. COSTELLO: No, that's correct.
21 They, I believe there were four public sessions held
22 throughout the span, different spans and they were
23 set so that it would be convenient for people to get
24 to those areas, but they were set with, throughout
25 the 88 miles of the lines. So, there were four areas

2 that were set.

3 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: So, all the
4 towns were notified, the --

5 A.L.J. COSTELLO: Everybody was
6 notified.

7 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Okay. All
8 right.

9 A.L.J. COSTELLO: Correct.

10 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Okay. That's
11 fine. And then it doesn't look like there has been
12 an application to the Army Corp of Engineers and some
13 of the water quality standards applications have not
14 been submitted yet. Is that correct?

15 A.L.J. COSTELLO: I believe that's
16 correct. I also believe that it's part of this
17 process, their certificate conditions and their E.M.
18 and C.P., they'll take care of all of this required.

19 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: So, this has to
20 go first and then --

21 A.L.J. COSTELLO: Correct.

22 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: -- the
23 submission has to go there. Okay. All right.
24 That's the only questions I had. Thank you.

25 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you.

2 Commissioner Howard.

3 COMMISSIONER HOWARD: I also will be
4 supporting this item. It is particularly gratifying
5 that this is done almost exclusively on the current
6 right-of-ways, and creative use of existing right-of-
7 ways is going to be essential. As other Article 7
8 cases come before this commission and we will, as the
9 Chair said, will need these types of facilities in
10 order to meet our clean energy goals going forward,
11 and I think it can be a model for other communities
12 and developers to try to maximize the amount of
13 existing right away and lack of disruption of the
14 areas that these facilities are going through. So,
15 thank you.

16 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you very much.
17 With that, we'll proceed to vote. My own vote is in
18 favor of the recommendation, the joint proposal with
19 modifications and grant the Certificate of
20 Environmental Capability and Public Need, as
21 discussed.

22 Commissioner Burman, how do you vote?

23 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: Yes.

24 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Commissioner Alissa,
25 how do you vote?

3 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Commissioner

4 Edwards, how do you vote?

5 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Yes.

6 CHAIRMAN RHODES: And Commissioner

7 Howard, how do you vote?

8 COMMISSIONER HOWARD: Yes.

9 CHAIRMAN RHODES: The item is approved
10 and the recommendation is adopted.

11 We will now move to the consent
12 agenda. Do any commissioners wish to comment on or
13 recuse from voting on any items on the consent
14 agenda? Commissioner, back to Burman.

15 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: Thank you. I do
16 have a number of items that I won't be voting with
17 the majority on. On items 161, 164 and 166, these
18 relate to gas items, modifying gas tariffs, 161 and
19 166, in particular, are modifying the gas tariffs in
20 non-firm demand response programs and interruptible
21 gas service programs.

22 I do recognize that; I believe staff
23 is really diligently working on these issues and
24 trying to figure out a pathway forward and that this
25 is one tool in the toolkit. I cannot in good

2 conscience vote for these items and must abstain. My
3 rationale for abstaining is because we are not
4 addressing some of the core issues around gas and,
5 therefore, looking at these in isolation is very
6 troubling to me.

7 I do believe that there are many folks
8 on all sides of the issue who are very interested in
9 addressing them. There are also side issues that are
10 -- that need to be dealt with in a way that is giving
11 people certainty and understanding of what our
12 pathway forward is. We do need to recognize that
13 these issues are very difficult but we need to tackle
14 them in a way that is helpful.

15 I do want to see, you know, some real
16 progress forward in figuring out solutions. My
17 concern here is that the reason I'm abstaining is I
18 don't have the critical information that I need to
19 holistically understand.

20 The items in particular 161 and 166,
21 the draft orders before us even talk about the fact
22 that we're looking at no new gas service and
23 addresses the moratoriums, at least by mentioning
24 that in both the ConEd and the National Grid
25 territories. Therefore, it is incumbent upon me to

2 drill down outside of the four corners of the order
3 and to understand, where are we? What are we doing?
4 How are we moving forward? What customers are
5 impacted? What new customers may be impacted and to
6 understand that? We have several items and several
7 orders that I've been looking at and it's confusing
8 to me as a decisionmaker on which ones we're looking
9 at and which ones we're moving forward on and how
10 they interrelate. It does include other items other
11 than gas, like energy efficiency and other REV
12 related items, and I recognize that and I recognize
13 that we need to figure that out and take into
14 consideration all folks.

15 For me, I do understand that National
16 Grid has submitted their implementation plan. I
17 think we should be looking at that and addressing
18 that, even though there was an extension to November
19 25th granted by the secretary of the commission on
20 the other aspects of that. We do need to look at it.

21 In the different cases, Smart
22 Solutions, ConEd Moratorium, as well as others, we
23 need to figure out how they all loop back together.

24 For me, I also want to see, you know,
25 there was discussion on a report that would be

2 addressing some of those issues. We need to fully
3 understand that, fully see it and also, looking at
4 the other issues and including asking for responses
5 by various folks, and that's something I think we
6 need to as a whole, as a commission really get under
7 the hood on and do -- do that due diligence.

8 So, therefore, I'm going to be
9 abstaining from all three of those items. It's
10 critically important that we address it in the real
11 time and so, it's -- it's concerning.

12 The other items that, excuse me, 365,
13 which is E.V. tariff, I'm going to be concurring as
14 it aligns with my past voting record, 367 and 371,
15 these are both seeking to modify electric tariffs
16 governing the purchase of renewable energy from new
17 distributed generators and approves a net energy
18 meeting -- metering program in each of these.

19 I will be concurring; however, I think
20 it's really important that we understand this and the
21 nature of this and how it relates in general. For
22 me, 367 and 371 while on its face appears to be
23 trying to address in a proper way, the need for these
24 tariffs. The munies in these cases, as well as
25 others, have sought to modify the tariffs on a

2 voluntary basis because they're not subject to the
3 utility tariffs and I understand that. It does in a
4 bit in these cases, both of these do it a bit
5 differently than the utility tariffs and I'm flagging
6 this because my concern is that I want to -- us to be
7 looking at how they munies are doing it differently.
8 I think in this case the way I understand it, is that
9 it makes sense, at least initially for them to be
10 doing it differently because to do it the way the
11 utilities are doing it would be very cumbersome for
12 the munies from a billing system perspective.

13 However, we really do need to watch,
14 if there are any negative ramifications to the
15 customers, especially on the cash out that go to the
16 developers. So, I'm just flagging it because I do
17 want to make sure that we are carefully looking at
18 them and seeing how this may be, especially as it
19 gets increasingly ramped up from renewable
20 perspective. So, really need to be careful on this
21 and really need to make sure that we're helping the
22 munies and the customers and the developers that will
23 be involved in this to incent that. So, something I
24 just want to make sure we're -- we're looking at. On
25 item 373, which is the PSEG Long Island Article 7,

2 I'm going to be voting no without prejudice.

3 I don't take that lightly. The way I
4 look at it for myself is that I reviewed all the
5 underlying papers. I looked carefully at this and
6 for me different from the 301 where it seemed like it
7 was much more deliberative and much more making sure
8 we were including folks and having public statement
9 hearings, this seems very rushed.

10 We did in September an underlying
11 order on PSEG Long Island at the same time that the
12 notice for this was going out and I can see that
13 there might be some confusion from those folks who
14 weighed in on the September, the one that led to the
15 September order, thinking that some of their concerns
16 that were being addressed there that they didn't need
17 to respond to further because they had already
18 submitted that. It may be confused.

19 I think there needs to be more notice
20 and time for those affected Long Islanders to weigh
21 in. I do support that it's being done in a phased in
22 project with focus planning and that the company
23 diligently is -- has been and will be continuing to
24 hold public meetings about the project in the
25 impacted communities. I know that there are three

2 open houses being held this week. However, to me
3 that's after we've decided it and there might be some
4 good information that we get from those folks
5 impacted, especially as there were changes made in
6 collaboration with staff after the fact -- after the
7 petition. So, for that, I can't in good conscience
8 vote for this and I want to make sure and that the
9 towns that have been vocal before in other areas as
10 recently as the September order, would be given time
11 and more direct outreach to ensure that any potential
12 issues would be addressed by us at the get-go. We've
13 worked well with these towns. The companies have
14 worked well with these towns. I don't think that
15 will change but I do want folks to be aware that I do
16 want to see less of what I see as a rush to get this
17 on. I don't understand what the need for that was.
18 So, I didn't have that in the record to feel
19 comfortable saying despite that we need to move
20 faster. So, that's where I come on 373, which is no
21 without prejudice to renew this before us.

22 On 374, I will be concurring but I do
23 want to just note on something I've raised before
24 that there is, there was a reliance on the staff's
25 work product, white papers in this case that led to

2 some reliance on them changing what they were doing
3 based on the direction that the staff was going in a
4 white paper.

5 Parties should be very aware that it's
6 the commission that speaks for itself and despite
7 staff white paper, that does not necessarily mean
8 that the commission as a body will rubberstamp that.
9 So, to the extent that there is some reliance on what
10 was being done in a staff white paper, I think that
11 it's really incumbent upon us to reinforce the
12 message that we will be reviewing as a whole all
13 parties' comments and taking that into consideration
14 and that white paper or any working documents from
15 staff does not mean that the commission is blessing
16 that as -- as a done deal. So, it's something that
17 people need to take into consideration.

18 On item 375, which is the commission -
19 - motion of the commission, the petition that was
20 made by NYSERDA to increase its administrative costs,
21 I am a no. For me, it is not something that I take
22 lightly. I do understand the hard work that NYSERDA
23 does but this budget request seems very bulky to me
24 and I am concerned about what that means. We do a
25 very good due diligence in not just accepting from

2 utilities a bulky budget and we work with them in
3 streamlining that as much as we can and really trying
4 to figure out what is absolutely appropriate and
5 necessary. I think the same rule should apply when
6 NYSERDA is looking for approval of their
7 administrative cost budget, as well as any other
8 budget.

9 For me, one of the things that made it
10 a definite no was when I looked at the NYSERDA
11 2019/20 budget and financial plan and saw based on
12 that and based on discussions with staff, that
13 approximately 85% of NYSERDA's fiscal year 2019/2020
14 revenues are related to commission programs, while
15 only 2.3% are from state appropriations. That means
16 that we really do need to have a lot more due
17 diligence when we're looking at our commission
18 orders, where we're looking at our commission
19 initiatives and we're looking at what all the parties
20 are doing to fully understand what those costs are,
21 not just within the bounds of the program but also in
22 terms of the resources that will be needed to
23 implement those programs.

24 I do want to see a lot more
25 transparency in looking at that and figure out ways

2 that we can reduce the administrative costs. Since
3 2017, NYSERDA has been good about lowering those
4 administrative costs but there, this is now a big
5 upswing and so, for that, I am concerned plus I do
6 recognize that this is one small piece of the puzzle.
7 There will be other things just like the financial
8 plan of NYSERDA noted that it wasn't necessarily
9 going -- it wasn't including everything that may
10 come. This petition isn't including everything else
11 that may come, including the work that will be done
12 with the new climate leadership and community
13 protection act with the council and NYSERA's role in
14 that. I also do recognize that we need to look at
15 parody among authorities in the agencies in terms of
16 staff resources and so for me, I can't look at this
17 in isolation without recognizing that our own staff
18 work very hard and also need to look at the parody
19 among the staff salaries and promotional
20 opportunities.

21 So, it's something that concerns me.

22 So, for that I will be a no.

23 On item 461, I'll be concurring and
24 that's it. Everything else I'll be a yes for.

25 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you

2 Commissioner Burman just for good order sake. I have
3 you as abstaining on 161, 164 and 166. I have you
4 concurring on 365, 367 and 461. I have you as a no
5 without prejudice on 373 and I have you as noes for
6 374 and 375, is that correct?

7 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: 374 I'm
8 concurring.

9 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Okay. Thank you.

10 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: 375 I'm a no and
11 461 I'm concurring.

12 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you very much.

13 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: Thank you.

14 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Secretary Phillips,
15 is that good?

16 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: I also want to
17 note that there was a concurrence with respect to
18 371, correct?

19 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Yeah, I meant to
20 list that one, too. Thank you.

21 COMMISSIONER BURMAN: Thank you.

22 CHAIRMAN RHODES: Thank you.

23 Commissioner Alesi, Commissioner Edwards.

24 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: On 161 and 166,
25 although I recognize that this is a piece and it's

2 not looking at it in its totality, I do think that we
3 need to make sure that we are addressing the critical
4 care customers. So, my -- what I want to just follow
5 up on, is the -- to make sure that the definition of
6 critical care customers is inclusive. So, it speaks
7 to areas of refuge. It speaks to hospitals and
8 nursing homes. I want to make sure that it includes
9 assisted living facilities, homeless shelters. So, I
10 would just like some follow-up information to make
11 sure that we are looking at critical care in overall
12 perspective and we're not leaving anyone out. So, I
13 do believe it's necessary to move forward, especially
14 because of that class of service. On 374, I would
15 like to better understand the valuation of the solar
16 methodology.

17 As a new commissioner, all of that was
18 done prior to my appointment. So, I would like to
19 just make sure that I understand how this calculation
20 impacts each region because we want to make sure that
21 however we are doing this fosters the solar program,
22 and if there's something in the calculation or
23 methodology that is negatively impacting that, I want
24 to make sure that we are taking a look at it and
25 addressing it if it's appropriate. So, I would like

just as a follow-up to better understand that. Okay.
And that's it for me.

CHAIRMAN RHODES: Jalila and Secretary
Phillips, can you organize those two briefings and
make sure that all commissioners have opportunity to
the information?
